POST 16 Global Awareness Trip to New York

Monday 7th October – Friday 11th October 2019 (TBC)

In autumn 2019, we will be running a trip to New York City for our sixth form students. Initially we can offer a total of **20 places** to current Year 11/12 students that will be continuing their education in Wolverley sixth form. We will fly for a 4 day (3 nights) trip to **New York**. Accommodation will be on a **room only** basis in the very heart of Manhattan. This is a fantastic opportunity for our students and we know that it will be an exciting and inspirational trip. Some of the places to be visited may include: -

- Madison Square Gardens
- Rockefeller Centre
- Sports event
- Broadway Show
- Ground Zero Memorial Gardens
- Central park
- Empire State Building

We regret that places can only be reserved on the receipt of a deposit of £50 on a first come first serve basis. **The cost of the trip including flights to New York, room only hotel accommodation and transport to and from airports will be approximately £849.00.** There will be other associated costs which include food, entrance fees and a Broadway show or Madison Square Garden Sport Game and as a result we will be encouraging the students to do some fund raising to help support these costs. Our preferred method of collecting payment is through the new ParentMail system. If you are yet to register or download the app and require any support, please contact reception. Those wishing to pay by cash or cheque can do so at the Finance Office in a sealed envelope with your son/daughter's name and year group written on the front.

Once we have confirmed which students are attending, we will issue a WCESS Consent Form for Off-Site Visit for your completion (the Annual Consent Form does not cover this visit). The Consent Form must be completed and returned to Reception. **Important:** Consent paper work not returned by the specified date may result in your son/daughter not being allowed to attend the trip. It is also important to ensure your son/daughter has any medication required (e.g. inhaler for asthma) with them on the first day of the visit, if this is not present, they may not be allowed to attend.
